2. ACCESSIBLE

Accessible Tourism Workshop and Town Ambassadors - Euan's Guide (Disabled Access Review Body) are preparing for an 'Accessible Tourism Workshop' which will be specifically designed for all retailers and businesses within Galashiels Town centre. The workshop will not only be led by Euan's Guide but they will also provide follow-on with practical assessments, for shops etc. to enable Galashiels to be known as one of Scotland's most 'accessible towns'. 3. **LEARNING**

School children's 'Woolly Wall' - Galashiels Academy are creating a 'woolly wall' which will be installed at a key gateway, on the high street, within the town centre. Wellness Map - connecting to nature - This map will specifically identify the 'free natural things' in the town that can encourage good health i.e. places to enjoy the sun, air, rest etc. This is a 'first' for small towns in Scotland. 7. HABITAT

Sustainable Way finding Thread through the Town – Work is being carried out on designing a temporary 'thread', that will run through the town and be linked to 'tapestry' themed sculptures. These will act as landmarks to, creatively, guide people around the place.
