SG National Collaborative Frameworks update

Civil Engineering Framework (Scotland) - Live

This multi-lot, multi-supplier framework went live in March 2024, for a period of 4 years. Specifically for civils projects between £5 million to £100 million, it has a total of 8 suppliers across its 3 national lots.

A new single supplier framework for Recruitment Advertising and PINS has been awarded and commenced on 11 July 2024 for a period of 4 years.

Vehicle Hire Services - Award

A new Category B contract for Vehicle Hire Services has been awarded and commenced on 1 September 2024 for a 4 year period. Scottish Public Bodies named on the contract are able to obtain a variety of short and long term vehicle hire services under the contract. The new contract has options for hiring electric vehicles to reduce carbon emissions. It also includes an option for a Car Club scheme where vehicles are located either near or on a public body's premises which offers flexibility of hiring and the potential for savings. Framework public bodies can contact the supplier's account manager to discuss options to maximise efficiencies and potential savings in relation to their vehicle hire requirements.

SG Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS) updates

Civil Engineering DPS (Scotland) - Award

The Contract Notice for the Civil Engineering Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS), for civils projects up to £5 million can now be used by public sector buyers to issue calls for competition. The DPS provides a list of pre-qualified suppliers for a variety of requirements, via three filters: type of civils works, location and value band.

Scotland Innovates

We have now received more than 180 submissions for innovative goods and services from businesses through the National Supplier led innovation service. Over 90% of submissions have come from SMEs, 80% are 'market ready' and over 600 registrations have been made.

In recent months the service has aligned with the Accelerated National Innovation Adoption (ANIA) Pathway with several submissions been taken forward to the NHS. The Accelerated National Innovation Adoption (ANIA) Pathway is a <u>Chief Scientist Office</u> funded programme focused on using technology to fast-track proven innovations into the healthcare frontline on a 'Once for Scotland' basis.

Go Awards Success

Our Utilities team won the 'Best Procurement Delivery Award' at the Go Awards for its work to procure a Water & Waste Water framework, the team's knowledge and expertise were utilised to deliver financial savings and substantial community benefits. The entry itself focused on the value the framework has delivered for the whole public sector, saving money and helping to save water through a range of water efficiency. In summary the framework delivered:

- cost avoidance savings of £23.4 million per annum
- water efficiencies savings of £2 million per annum through initiatives such as leak detection and meter re-sizing
- supported a host of community benefits including the provision of a 'Water Efficiency Fund', which funded 15 public sector water efficiency projects resulting in financial savings and environmental benefits
