SG national collaborative frameworks update

Civil Engineering Framework (Scotland) - live

The framework has progressed potential projects in the pipeline for 2025, completing successful early market engagement with framework suppliers. The planned next phase of these are for Spring 2025, when we hope to see full procurement exercises commence. We continue to engage with key stakeholders targeting potential civil engineering works, and focus on the construction pipeline information from the Scottish Futures Trust to manage capacity down the line.

The framework is for civil engineering projects between £5 million to £100 million. For more information, including buyer's guide and supporting guidance: <u>Civil Engineering Framework (25 March 2024 to 24 March 2028)</u>.

Gas and Electricity Frameworks - price set

The framework prices for the wholesale cost of Gas and Electricity have now been set for 1 April 2025 – 31 March 2026. Information has been sent to all framework customers. Questions can be directed to <u>Aidan Cardases</u>.

Mobile Client Devices (Laptops and Mobile Workstations) - extension

This framework has been extended until 15 November 2025. An Invitation to Tender for a replacement framework will be issued in April 2025.

Software Value Added Reseller Services framework - extension

The framework commenced service on 1 May 2023 for an initial two-year period with the option of two 12-month extension periods. Scottish Procurement has utilised the optional extension period and the framework will now expire on 30 April 2026. This single-supplier framework is available to all Scottish public bodies and Third Sector organisations on a direct award basis.

Marketing Services - re-let update

The re-let for this framework has commenced development. The existing framework expires 31 August 2026. Please contact <u>Colin Anderson</u> for further information.

Publishing Print Design and Associated Services (PPDAS) - re-let update

The re-let for this framework is well underway, with tenders due by 26 March 2025. We are currently on track to conclude the live procurement exercise and award a new framework commencing 1 October 2025. Please contact <u>Neil Mactavish</u> for more information.

Provision of Media Services - re-let update

The re-let for this <u>framework</u> is well underway, with the commencement of the tender evaluation stage. The existing framework (SP-20-002) is a collaborative framework accessible by the whole of the Scottish Public Sector and due to expire on 31 August 2025. We are currently on track to conclude the live procurement exercise and award a new framework to commence on 1 September 2025.

Provision of Postal Services - re-let update

The re-let process for this <u>framework</u> is well underway, with tenders due for return on 26 March 2025. The existing framework (Ref: SP-19-035) is a collaborative framework accessible by the whole of the Scottish Public Sector and due to expire on 30 June 2025. We are currently on track to conclude the live procurement exercise and award a new framework commencing 1 July 2025.

Provision of interpreting, translation and transcription services – re-let update

The re-let process for this <u>framework</u> has just begun, and the first User Intelligence Group (UIG) meeting with existing user organisations held. The existing framework (Ref: SP-21-001) is a collaborative framework accessible by the whole of the Scottish Public Sector and is due to expire on 11 November 2025. SG Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS) updates

Civil Engineering DPS (Scotland) - live

The Civil Engineering Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS) for projects up to £5 million went live in December 2024 and in February 2025 one of our public sector customers has published the first tender under the system. Currently, the DPS has 26 suppliers. 20 of them are SMEs (77%). Suppliers can apply to join the DPS at any time using the information included within the Contract Notice: View Notice - Public Contracts Scotland.

Requirements Reserved for Supported Businesses DPS (Scotland) - live

The Requirements Reserved for Supported Businesses Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS) runs until 8 September 2025. A re-let is underway. Currently, the DPS has 22 supported business suppliers, all are SMEs. Suppliers can apply to join the DPS at any time using the information included within the Contract Notice: <u>View Notice - Public Contracts Scotland</u>.

New 'Guidance for public sector buyers on purchase of goods and services from Supported Businesses' has been published on the <u>Procurement Journey</u> with the ministerial foreword from the Minister for Public Finance. Further communications to follow across all public bodies in Scotland.

The new document provides guidance for public sector buyers who procure goods and services, to enable them to better consider how procurement activity is conducted, and contracts are developed, to reduce barriers and enable participation of supported businesses in Public Sector Procurement.

National Collaborative Procurement Service Enhancement

The NCPD <u>Service Enhancement Plan</u> was published on 10 March. The plan sets out a two-year road map to improve services and introduce an improved customer account management approach to drive greater value for our customers. A Service Enhancement Programme has been established and a User Intelligence Group with representation from across the public sector will help to guide and inform delivery. Early work is focused on a framework portfolio review, enhancing our approach to communications and engagement and improving access to our framework information.

Water and Waste Water Framework - Water Efficiency Fund

We are pleased to announce that the Business Stream Water Efficiency Fund 2025 will open in April. A benefit of the Scottish Government Water and Waste Water Framework, the annual fund, sponsored by Business Stream, invites applications of up to £100,000 to support water efficiency initiatives in the public sector.

A total of 16 projects received funding during 24/25. These included £12,500 to National Museums of Scotland to conduct water conservation audits across 5 of their sites, £10,000 to Highland Council to invest in a public convenience water efficiency project and £17,841 for Renfrewshire Council to purchase pool covers for Riverbrae Additional Support Needs School.
